Abstract

Individuals with/without vocational skills/livelihood diversification were interviewed on whether possession of vocational skills/diversified means of livelihood influenced their level of satisfaction with their livelihood and participation in electoral processes. The results showed that possession/lack of vocational skills and livelihood diversification influenced the level of satisfaction of the respondents with their means of livelihood. Also, possession/lack of vocational skills and livelihood diversification does not have any influence on the level of participation in electoral processes by the respondents.
